New this year, we are offering Brain Chase an 8-week virtual camp program (with week by week options) that provides online camp in a unique and engaging way.

Your child will work as a team with other campers to conquer a total of eight escape rooms. Campers will solve a new mystery each week by advancing through a series of interactive rooms. To escape, the team must click on objects that will give them codes, questions, and clues to help them advance while learning new material and practicing skills they've learning throughout the school year.

To keep up with the group escape room challenges, each team will need to stay sharp by completing three elective challenges each day in topics like engineering, art, sports, reading, photography, science, writing, math, cooking, typing, and yoga.

Brian Chase at **Chesterbrook Academy** is a fun alternative to traditional day camp where students can continue to learn and engage with friends throughout the summer months.
